Dale Stevens was born in Rumford, Maine on November 19, 1945. He attended Bethel schools before entering Gould Academy in the class of 1964. He played football, baseball, and basketball (senior year captain) at Gould. Upon graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Army on June 25, 1964, underwent basic training at Fort Dix, New Jersey and advanced training at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey in the field of electronic warfare equipment repair (Military Occupational Specialty 26K20). He was assigned to the Army Security Agency's (ASA) Field Station in Asmara, Ethiopia (now Eritrea) in its Stonehouse Division.
